So, for all of you interested readers, here we go

After the printing of QUESTPROBE FEATURING THE MULK, Commodore Computers International will be producing the following formats:

Commodore 64 Disk, Commodore 4/plus Disk, Apple II Disk, IBM PC Disk, IBM PC Jr. Disk, Atari Home Computers Disk.

These formats should be available from any outlet that sells Commodore products. If you can't find them, you can

order directly from Scott Adams, Inc., Box 3435, 155 Sabal Palm Drive, Box 3435, 155 Sa Longwood, FL 32750.

Yours truly will still be writing and programming the Adventures, but those formats will be marketed and produced by Commodore! They will be priced tentatively at \$29.95, but this may change when they hit the market. Also Scott Adams, Inc. will be selling the following formats directly: Atari 32k tape, Commodore 64 tape (with full graphics!), Color Computer tape 16k, TRS-80 Model 1, 3, 4 disk. Sorry to say, currently there are no plans for Colecovision, TI or Spectravideo. Macintosh owners standby --- we will probably have a format out before the end of the year!

Adventures usually allow one player at a time, or as many friends who care to sit around the screen and kibbitz. I'm hoping that QUESTPROBE #3, for some disk formats, will allow the player to control all of the members of the Fantastic Four. I think that will be another first in the field of high-resolution computer adventure games. Also, starting with QUESTPROBE #2, there will be full sentence input. 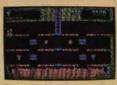
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
