allows great detail and complexity in the adventure. In Artic adventures you can explore strange new worlds without leaving the comfort of your armchair. Your computer will act as your puppet and control your senses. You instruct the computer in short phrases, usually verb-noun. For example, if in the

adventure you see a laser gun then you would enter GET LASER or GET GUN. When entering your commands you may use the DELETE key to erase any letters.

In each location you may find objects which you can use and manipulate in further locations to help you progress.

As this adventure is very large, the program also has routines with which you can save your position to

return to it at a later date. To save a game, enter 'QUIT'. You will then be asked 'DO YOU WANT TO SAVE THE GAME' to which you should reply 'Y'. You will next be asked to enter a file name. If you have a disk drive attached then the file will be saved to disk. If you have more than one drive you should specify which drive you wish to use when you type in the file name.

If no disk drive is attached then the game will be saved to tape. You will notice that when you first begin the

adventure you will be asked if you wish to restore a previously played game. Normally you would answer with 'N' for no, but if you wish to load in a partially completed attempt, answer 'Y'. You will then be asked to type in the file name which should be identical to that used to save it. If a disk drive is connected the game will be loaded from

disk. Otherwise cue up your tape and press play on

the recorder. The game will then continue from

Loading your Adventure

where you last left it.

- 1. Set up the computer as described in the Commodore 64 user manual
 - Insert the cassette in the tape unit. Ensure it is fully rewound.
- 3. Type in LOAD"", I, I and follow the prompts on the screen
- 4. On loading in, the program will auto-run displaying the title page.
