

## Playing Instructions

Adventures are interactive fantasies in which you play the role of a character in an unknown environment. Through the computer, you control your character and try to solve the mystery with plain english statements like "OPEN THE GATE" or "GET THE KEY".

The computer considers the first word the verb and the last word the noun. It also only looks at the first two letters of each word. Therefore, "OP GA" means the same as "OPEN THE GATE".

Enter "IN" (for "inventory") to see what you are carrying. Look at individual items for further clues.

In all of our adventures, you will never get into a "dead end" situation; there is always a way out (unless you die).

Below is a list of verbs that you can use (not all verbs will work in all adventures). The discovery of all the nouns is left up to you; that's part of the fun!

## Loading Instructions

To LOAD the program hold down SHIFT and press RUN/STOP. Your screen will go blank for about 10 seconds until the program is found. Then press the CBM key and the program will load and run.
