SAGENO LIZARD. Lizard far more poisonous than gila monster. To be avoided.

ALLIGATOR (CAYMAN). Very aggressive. River swimming must be avoided at all times.

PIRANHA. Vicious small fish. Overrated, but avoid riverswimming.

STINGRAY. Found near river banks. Delivers incapacitating sting if stepped on.

NSRT FIELD EQUIPMENT PACKS All Field Parties are equipped with everything they will need for field work. It is the responsibility of the Field Parties to thoroughly inventory and examine their equipment!

USE OF THE NSRT FIELD COMPUTER

All Field Parties are provided with a portable computer for use in communicating with NSRT Base.

After turning on the computer, an Input Code will be required to open transmission.

Each Field Party will be informed of their Standard Input Code, and their Emergency Input Code. Standard Codes can be used at any time favorable for satellite transmission. Emergency Codes should be used only during emergencies.

Field Parties should make a note of their respective codes. NSRT CODED FIELD MAP COORDINATES
